RACING MANAGER'S REPORT by Shaun Mathieson

INCREASE TO PRIZEMONEY DISTRIBUTION

As advised in last week's media release SA Greyhound Racing will pay an extra \$621,000 towards stakemoney in 2011/12 bringing our total distribution to \$5.4 million. This includes an increase to Thursday night staking of 15.5% and the new stakemoney on offer for the Friday meetings at Gawler. It also detailed GRSA's stimulus package which included increased SA bred payments, a supplementary travel rebate for trainers in regional areas affected by lack of racing opportunities and \$500,000 towards training, trialling and racing related capital works. Turn to the back of Kennel Capers for last weeks Media Release detailing the strategic reforms for the industry along with GRSA's stimulus package which is also available on the GRSA website.

I have detailed below how the increases will affect the Angle Park Thursday nights and also Feature race dates for the new season.

Angle Park Thursday

Angle Park Thursday night will have an increase of over \$240,000 which includes basic Grade 5 races now at \$2,600 and Open grade events now \$3,400. Feature Events have also been increased. Angle Park Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday prizemoney levels have remained at 2010/2011 levels.

Angle Park Features Increased

There has been plenty of increases to the Feature Races which include Group 3 events needing to go to \$36,000 to retain Group status and the Adelaide Cup being worth over \$100,000, the winner receiving \$75,000. With the increases to the normal Thursday night prizemoney this also means that most of the Heats, Preludes and Semi Finals of Feature races have also been increased.

***The Group 3 Gawler Gold Cup Series to be run on Sunday 30th October (Heats) and Sunday 6th November (Final) has also been increased with the final being increased to \$36,000 (\$30,000) and the consolation now worth \$2,500 (\$2,000).



PRIZEMONEY BOOST FOR 40th ADELAIDE CUP IN OCTOBER

With the new format of the Adelaide Cup in October we have been able to increase prizemoney for the series along with programming opportunities for the locally trained greyhounds in a lead up to the Cup. I will be able to release more conditions in the coming weeks as October is only a few months away.

I have listed the increases below -

In January under the three week (Top 16) conditions we ran 8 open Heats on the first night worth \$3,500 each and an Interstate Challenge worth \$12,500. The second night was Semi Final night where we had 4 Semi Finals at \$6,500 leading into the Adelaide Cup Final the following week worth \$96,000. Total prizemoney for the series was \$162,500.

In October we will be running four SA Preludes on Thursday 22nd September and four SA Preludes on Thursday 29th September worth \$3,400 each under special local conditions with the first three from each Prelude qualifying for the Heats which are a great boost for the locals.

The Adelaide Cup two week series kicks off on Thursday 6th October with up to eight open Heats worth \$7,250 each (\$5,000 to the winner) with the Final on Thursday 13th October. The Group 1 Final will be worth \$107,500 with the winner receiving \$75,000 and on the night we will also run an Adelaide Cup Consolation worth \$14,500 which replaces the Interstate Challenge. The Cup series will be worth \$180,000 which is an increase of over \$14,000 not including up to eight local Preludes.

AGRA GROUP RACING CALENDAR

As mentioned last week the AGRA Group Racing Calendar should be available within the next week but there are a couple of criteria that GRSA need to meet to accommodate Group status.

Most importantly is the eligibility criteria for Age Restricted Events. This will affect our Coffex Coffee SA Oaks and Coca Cola SA Derby's to be run in September. Under the National conditions these races will be restricted to greyhounds no older than 30 months of age on the first day of the month in which heats of the event are scheduled. This will mean that it will be open to more greyhounds than in previous years. Also under the National conditions greyhounds that have not won a maiden race will be ineligible to contest the Oaks and Derby which is a change from previous years and now means that qualifying performances and Maiden dogs are ineligible.

The next is prizemoney levels. Our Group finals need to be \$75,000 to the winner for Group 1 events, \$40,000 for Group 2 and \$25,000 for Group 3. This means that the Group 1 Adelaide Cup Final will be worth \$107,500 which is an increase from January. All of our other features are Group 3 events which means the total prizemoney for the final will be \$36,000 which is also increased from 2010/2011.

GAWLER PRODUCE HEATS

Greyhound Racing SA and the Gawler Greyhound Racing Club conducted 5 Heats of the 2011 Gawler Produce Stake on Tuesday afternoon. At close of nominations, 33 greyhounds remained from those that had made the required payments, leading to the five heats.



As a result there will be two semi-finals next Tuesday 28th June, with the Final to be run on Sunday 3rd July as a twilight meeting, covered by Sky Racing.

The 2011 Gawler Produce Stake is a series for greyhounds whelped in 2009 and is a "Futurity" event requiring payments which began in October last year. A total of 108 greyhounds were paid up for originally. This resulted in a pool of \$10,855 from the futurity payments. GRSA adds to this pool, both with extra prizemoney along with its normal prizemoney pool, resulting in a total pool of \$34,900. The prizemoney breakdown for the series is as follows:
Tuesday 21st June 5 x heats @ \$1,600
Tuesday 28th June 2 x Semi-finals @ \$2,300
Sunday 3rd July Final @ \$20,000 (incl.\$500 breeders bonus) & Consolation @ \$2,300.

Breakdown for the Final will be:
First - \$13,500 (inc \$500 for breeder)
Second - \$3,600
Third - \$1,800
Unplaced - \$220

The winner of the Final is also eligible for a \$7,000 bonus if it can win the 2011 Gawler Gold Cup in November. The Bonus was not won in 2010, so it has jackpotted by \$1,000 for 2011. If the winner of the Produce is SA Bred, there is also a \$1,000 SA Bred Bonus. The first three placegetters from each Heat will qualify for the two Semi-Finals along with the fastest fourth placegetter; the other four fourth placegetters will be declared reserves.

Change of Nomination Day for Produce Final Meeting

Owners & Trainers should note that we have changed the nomination day for Produce Final night on Sunday July 3rd. We had listed the nominations as closing on the normal Tuesday morning. However due to the drawing of the Final field after the semi-finals and the re-nomination for the consolation, we have changed the nomination closing time to Wednesday 29th June at 9.00am.

A reminder that any greyhound that competes in the heats is eligible to re-nominate for the Consolation. Finishing position in the Semi-Finals will determine the order of entry for those that re-nominate. If not enough greyhounds that competed in the Semis re-nominate, then we will revert to those that ran in the heats.

PORT AUGUSTA CITY COUNCIL CUP

Saturday sees the running of the 2011 Port Augusta City Council Cup Final, following 3 heats last week. Prizemoney for the Final is \$3,000 and there is also a Cup Consolations on the program. Racing will commence at 1.00pm, with the Cup at 2.25pm and the last of seven races at 3.25pm.

GAWLER TRIALS

With the introduction of the new Friday Sky Racing timeslot at Gawler during the day, trialling arrangements have had to be changed to accommodate extra racing at the venue. The Friday morning trials have had to be shifted to accommodate racing and will now be conducted on Monday mornings from July onwards. These trials will only be conducted on Mondays after a Gawler Sunday meeting as the track has already been prepared. If the Sunday meeting is conducted elsewhere then there will be no trials on Monday morning. These trials will be run between 7.30am and 9.30am and should hopefully provide that extra opportunity to trial.

Please be mindful however that there will be NO trials regardless on Monday Public Holidays. The first date should be Monday 4th July.

The normal Wednesday trials at Gawler will remain as per normal.

GRSA will review all racing and trialling at Gawler once the Friday meetings have been implemented.

FINANCE MANAGER'S REPORT By Brian Trumble

PRIZEMONEY

GRSA currently withholds all payments in relation to a greyhound that has been swabbed until after the result of analysis has been received. GRSA recognises the pressures on trainers and owners and the difficulties associated with payments being withheld, especially when considered against the low number of positive swabs recorded. GRSA is pleased to announce that from 1st July 2011 only payments greater than \$3,500 will automatically be withheld if a swab has been taken. Prize Money will be paid as normal for greyhounds swabbed, subject to the trainer acknowledging that prize money must be repaid if a positive swab is determined.

Where prize money is greater than \$3,500, payment will continue to be withheld pending the swab analysis result.

These changes should provide a more timely payment of prize money and eliminate unnecessary administration of withholding payments.

NEWS RELEASE FORMER RACING GREYHOUNDS TO RECEIVE HEALTH CARE FROM SA VETERINARY STUDENTS

TAFE SA is set to foster 20 former racing greyhounds every year, providing them with health checks, vaccinations, dental care and more under an agreement with Greyhound Racing SA (GRSA).

A Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) signed today (Thursday 23 June) between Greyhound Racing SA (GRSA) and TAFE SA will give students from the Veterinary and Applied Science Centre (VASC) some valuable practical experience.

If the partnership is successful then more GAP dogs may be fostered and receive veterinary health care from the students.

The Greyhound Adoption Program (GAP) finds temporary nurturing homes for greyhounds whose racing careers have ended – bridging the gap between a racing life and a permanent new home for retired greyhounds.

The students will also deliver an animal care and behavioural training program to prepare the dogs for life after racing.

GRSA Chief Executive Officer Mr Matt Corby said they're delighted to have the support of TAFE SA to help them increase the reach of the GAP program.

"Animal welfare is a priority for the South Australian greyhound racing industry and the funding and administrative support we provide to GAP is a key part of our strategy.

"However, GAP is a non-profit organisation and still relies on volunteers and the goodwill of organisations like TAFE SA to maintain its services," said Mr Corby.



“The students’ skills and knowledge will be greatly enhanced by the partnership and the opportunity to care for these loving and loyal dogs.”

There are also plans in place to extend the partnership beyond the GAP program through development of a micro-chipping course and a Certificate IV in Racing (Stewards Administration).

“Our objective is to provide a pathway into the racing industry for students by giving them a recognised qualification and some real hands on experience,” said Mr Corby.

Mr David Royle, Managing Director, TAFE SA Adelaide North Institute said he was delighted that the Institute is able to provide the first steps for these animals in their journey from working dogs to much-loved family pets, “As well as looking after their health care needs, our students will be actively involved in helping these kind and gentle dogs transition from the racing world, in preparation for their eventual placement into a family environment.”

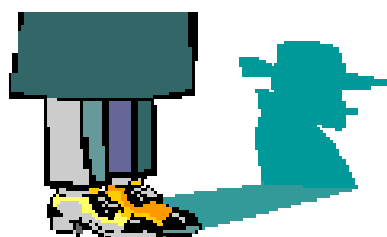

The two highlight's of tonight's racing are race 5 and race 8 on the programme. The Boags Premium SA Owned Final certainly has 8 quality runners engaged. The 2 main chances look to be the Murray Harvey trained Airbag and the classy Lektra Ling, they have both drawn the book ends of the field with the pacey Airbag coming from the red. The Bombastic Shiraz sprinter has a terrific record of 5 wins and 6 placings from just 20 starts at headquarters, and her 30.04 gallop last week makes her the one to beat. Lektra Ling has a one two effect in his starts in recent weeks, with a win and a 2nd in his last 4 runs and if the numbers fall right he should win the grade 5 final and I will throw my ouija board away. There are a heap of chances for the minors and I would add in Strike Bullion at a bit of value along with Where's Cisco, put in the Peter Hurley chaser Emerley Road and that should be the pick 4.

The Free For All again looks to be another exciting event with the in form sprinter Dark Duo being the one to beat. The Rob Harnas trained greyhound has been in similar types of fields here in recent weeks and there is no reason why he can't make it 3 wins on end. Kennel mate Point Two Over is dropping back in distance tonight and looks the main danger from his draw of 1 and we all know he is very strong at both ends of the 515m journey. Led Zeppelin led everywhere bar the post here last week when a long nostril 2nd behind Dark Duo and can give plenty of cheek in this event. Cascada Star is a chance of running into the pick 4 from a long way back.

Best Bets - The pacey Woodside Fred is resuming in race 2 and he can ping to the front and win. I have already tipped Airbag and Dark Duo and you could go all up on all 3.

Best Eachway - Venture to race 4 in Logan Bale the Lisa Rasmussen trained sprinter has finally drawn a box on the rails and is more than capable of pinching this.

Best Roughie - In the veterans race the Petar Jovanovic's Sargent Trigga. He was a big run from this draw last start and there is no reason why he can't go one better tonight.

THE RESTRUCTURE

The Restructure of racing was always going to happen here in South Australia in recent years. We all should have known that SA had far too many tracks for the number of dogs that are available. It is easy to say keep this track open, shut that one, but ultimately someone has to make the decision. If it's right or wrong you can NEVER keep everyone happy. The up keep of all the venues will always impact on the industry and we can either race for a trophy or for hard cold cash.

With the new racing dates for Gawler on a Friday the dish lickers are virtually racing every day of the week and if you can you shouldn't miss a start with your mate in the backyard. I too remember all the days at the country venues such as Kulpara, Port Lincoln and Mintaro etc, but unfortunately we have to go with the times. But in my opinion one thing that hasn't happened for quite a few years is a real concerted effort at trying to bring that new person into the industry.



Most of the syndicates are made up of former greyhound followers, such as an ex-trainer, owner or family friend. The industry needs to have a person like a 'Ray Fewings' to hand pick a couple of likely lads from a table at Angle Park on a race night and show them the behind the scenes of the industry. Take them behind the boxes and show them the start of a race, take another two upstairs and have a look at the racing from above where the race callers do their work, behind the catching pen is another big eye opener for patrons who would normally only be looking through the glass out over the track. All we need is one of these people to mention what a terrific night they had and saw at Angle Park and the excitement of being shown around behind the scenes. Mention it to one person at a club or barbecue and that will be the way we will get new people into the industry either as a punter or an owner and let's hope as a trainer.....
