CEO'S REPORT

PORT AUGUSTA GREYHOUND RACING CLUB READY TO RACE

Racing at the Port Augusta Club will continue. They have successfully submitted a plan in response to the requirement of Greyhound Racing SA for Clubs to demonstrate their long-term viability within the industry's strategic framework.

Racing at Port Augusta was suspended from June 30 subject to submitting that plan. The two other Clubs which had race dates suspended from June 30, Port Pirie and Barmera, have advised that they will not be submitting for future race dates, thereby reducing the number of registered SA racing Clubs from seven to five – Angle Park, Gawler, Strathalbyn, Mount Gambier and Port Augusta (Non-TAB).

The decision by Greyhound Racing SA reflects the Board's unqualified confidence in the voluntary management of the Port Augusta Club, headed up by Ivan Broadbridge and Len Grantham. Despite the challenges that the Port

Augusta Club has encountered over the years – stemming from remoteness and limited commercial opportunity – the diligence and professionalism of the Club's stakeholders have secured its survival where other Clubs have fallen.

As of this year, Port Augusta has been one of two remaining Clubs (the other being Barmera) whose racing product does not receive Sky Racing or TAB coverage, and so are limited in their ability to generate income for the industry.

Notwithstanding these limitations, the closure of any regional track has a likely consequence of directly reducing participation in that region.

The decision to resume racing at Port Augusta effectively strikes a strategic balance between the commercial and participation objectives of the industry. Prior to June 30, Greyhound Racing SA conducted more than 30 annual race meetings across its two Non-TAB venues. Under the new arrangements, Port Augusta will race up to 12 times annually and will contribute an equal



share towards the provision of stakemoney for those meetings.

Port Augusta will commence racing on the 3rd October subject to a track and facilities inspection w/c 19th September.

BREEDERS REBATE – FOR LITTERS WHELPED FROM NOVEMBER 1:

Registered Breeders may be eligible to receive up to \$2k rebate on expenses directly associated with the breeding/whelping of any litter.....For more information go to www.grsa.com.au.

The Breeders Rebate Claim Forms will be available shortly and will be sent to all Registered Breeders, as well as being available online and at the Offices of GRSA.

Please be advised that Brood bitches that are currently in pup (or just about to be mated/inseminated) with a projected whelping date of November 1 or later need to complete a Rebate Claim Form prior to the end of September to be eligible for the rebate in relation to those litters.

From October 1, the Rebate Claim Form will need to be submitted to GRSA prior to mating/insemination for a given litter to be eligible under the scheme.

RECENT BREEDING & STAKEMONEY INCENTIVES

The recent introduction of the Breeders Rebate Scheme has been introduced as a pragmatic response to the recent decline in breeding activity which targets some of the cost and risk associated with breeding litters in this state. This assistance is aimed to assist directly with a known supply issue, however this represents only one part of the broader equation (albeit a significant one). For greyhound racing in SA to thrive in the years ahead, we need to continue the issues that are evident at the demand end of the spectrum, that is to say, making ownership more viable.

Greyhound Racing SA has budgeted \$500k towards training and trialling facilities in support of participation for SA participants and will be continuing to work with the industry to identify the most effective programs for expenditure to ensure availability of



rearing facilities and accessible training and trialling opportunities across the northern, metro and southern regions.

INITIATIVES FROM JULY 1:

- \$621,000 increase in stakemoney including approximately \$135,000 in SA Bred bonuses
- Introduction of SA Bred Group Race Super-Bonuses of up to \$12,500 (see below)

The SUPER-BONUS concept is designed to establish the aspirational goal for SA breeders and owners by ensuring that success is highly rewarded.

The super-bonus scheme is premised upon a 100% dividend to breeders. The following is a summary of the proposed bonus by race:

The super-bonuses for interstate events will only be applied for series/events that are open entry. Events that are restricted by age or gender are eligible for the bonus. Events that are exclusively open to SA Bred runners or incorporate other restrictions, such as 'sweepstake' events, puppy/auction Classics and maiden series are not eligible for the super-bonus.

The Super-Bonuses have been made available from July 1 for greyhounds with a whelping date of no earlier than July 1, 2009.

RACING MANAGER'S REPORT

COFFEX COFFEE OAKS FINAL

Last Thursday night we saw four enthralling heats of the Coffex Coffee Oaks where the first two placegetters from each heat qualified for tonight's Group 3 final.

The fastest qualifier for the final was the Jeff Britton trained Victorian Mepunga Nicky who led throughout



from box 8 to record a slick 29.77 for the 515m defeating the Troy Iwanyk trained It's A Blur by 1¼ lengths. She has drawn box 3 for the final tonight and looks a top chance of making it back to back wins.

She was .01 of a second quicker than boom WA sprinting star Miata trained by Paul Stuart who came from well back in her heat to record a brilliant victory by over 4 lengths in 29.78 from the Graeme Bate trained Carol Allen. Miata is undefeated in her 7 lifetime starts and is the current track record holder over the 530m at Cannington however her biggest test will come tonight after drawing box 8 for the final.

Jessenia Bale for Shaun Matcott took out the first heat of the night impressively leading throughout from box 7 to defeat Irma Bale by 2¾ lengths for Graeme Bate in a flying 29.80 and looks to be South Australia's best chance of taking out the feature final. She has again drawn box 7 but she has been in sensational form and has the local track experience over her rivals.

The final heat was an evenly contested affair where Jeff Britton produced his second heat winner of the evening in Dream Chick who raced up near the lead before powering home to score by 2½ lengths in a solid 30.23 defeating Bralyn Ella for Troy Murray.

They will all be chasing the \$36,000 Group Three Final tonight which is race 8 on the program and is listed to jump at 9.11pm (SA time). Good luck to all connections.

As an added bonus for oncourse patrons Braakensiek who won the 2002 SA Oaks will lead the final field out for this year's event. At the ripe old age of 11½ she was the last South Australian winner of the Oaks when trained by master trainer Colin Wachtel. We appreciate owner Darren Franklin for making her available for tonight's feature final.

If you thought last week's heats of the Coffex Coffee Oaks leading into tonight's Group 3 final was exciting and produced ultra-competitive racing then tonight's heats of the Coca Cola Derby potentially looks even better. In terrific news for GRSA we have 7 quality heats totalling 53 nominations which are double the nominations of last year which was only 27. The new format of heats straight into a final looks to have been well received by trainers resulting in some of the best young chasers in the land appearing at Angle Park.

Again the Interstate trainers will play a huge hand in the Coca Cola Derby heats with the likes of Jeff Britton, Rob Britton and Graeme Bate all having multiple runners engaged in the series.

However the South Aussies also can't be taken lightly with the likes of Pints

Delight, Hotel Alabama, Ruarc Entity and Podsiadly all racing in career best form.

The winners of each heat and the fastest second placegetter will qualify for next week's \$36,000 Group 3 Final with the box draw taking place after the running of race 10 on course tonight.

HOWARD ASHTON NEW EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF AGRA

A name well known to not only South Australian greyhound racing but Australian greyhound racing in Howard Ashton has been appointed the new Executive Officer of AGRA taking over the position held by Brenton Scott. PAWS OF THUNDER STARTS THIS SATURDAY

Group 1 racing heads to New South Wales this Saturday night with the running of the Greyhound Recorder Paws Of Thunder at Wentworth Park. There are 10 outstanding heats on the program all looking to qualify for the semi-finals on September 24th with the \$100,000 to the winner Group 1 final on October 1st. The first of 10 heats will start at 6.57pm (SA time) Saturday night where the racing is guaranteed to be exciting.

GREYHOUND OF THE MONTH - AUGUST

Greyhound of the month for August was Kalden Mayhem for trainer Troy Murray.

The Panel was unanimous in its decision for August, voting Kalden Mayhem as the Greyhound of the Month. Kalden Mayhem has been a model of consistency all year and has polled votes in 4 out of the previous 7 months finally breaking through with the August award.

He started the month off with a fine win in the heat of the Macro Meats National Distance Championship State Series defeating top liners Satanic Cash and Forty Twenty. He then stepped out a week later and repeated the dose in the State Final leading throughout from box 1 and recording a slick 43.43 for the 731m holding off the challenge of Forty Twenty.

By winning the State Final Kalden Mayhem then headed to Brisbane in late August to represent SA in the Group 1 National Distance Final at Albion Park against the best stayers in the land. The son of Big Daddy Cool and Abbadale Gold ran a bold race behind super stayer Dashing Corsair, stalking the champ for most of the race before finishing a gallant third for SA.

In August Kalden Mayhem had three starts for two wins and a third bringing his career to 50 starts for 21 wins and 15 placings and over \$64,000 in stakemoney.



RUN OF THE MONTH - AUGUST

The Run of the Month for August 2011 was the Rob Harnas trained Point Two Over for his super winning performance in the State Final of the Macro Meats National Sprint Championship at Angle Park on August 11.

In a top line up of SA sprinters including his more fancied kennel star Dark Duo he began brilliantly from the outside box to race up near the lead early. Down the back straight the son of Collision and Camden Shiraz stamped himself on the rest of the field by running to the front and going to the line powerfully to hold off Dark Duo by over 2 lengths. Point Two Over's time of 29.85 was blistering and would see him head to Brisbane to represent SA at the Nationals in late August ultimately running a fantastic race to finish fourth in the final.

SISTER CITIES CUP FINALISTS

Our local qualifiers for the Sister Cities Cup had their final hit outs before flying to Christchurch today stopping over in Sydney and arriving in New Zealand tomorrow in preparation for the big one on Thursday 22nd September.

Aston Thomas for Troy Murray trialled between races at the Gawler meeting last Friday and impressed over the 531m recording a time of 30.92 with a first split of 3.37. He will be in the care of Ray Murray for his tilt at the Sister Cities Cup title.

Lesley Sermon then trialled Sargent Trigga on Monday night between races at Angle Park accompanied by her handy greyhound Johnny Will over the 515m. Johnny Will won the trial in a flying 29.92 with Sargent Trigga only 3 lengths away topping him off nicely for his New Zealand trip.

Sargent Trigga will be in the care of Ray Barkla whilst in New Zealand and we wish both Ray's and our chargers a safe journey and the best of luck in what looks to be one of the best Sister Cities Cup's ever held.

We already know that National Sprint Champion Metz Magic from Brisbane is on the plane and ran another nice race last Thursday night at Albion Park in finishing second but we now also know



the representatives from Auckland who had their one off heat last Sunday and what two outstanding greyhounds these are.

Have A Yap for trainer D. Schofield won her heat over the 527m in a sizzling 30.40 defeating Sergio for trainer G. Harding by 4 lengths. New Zealand sprinting star Have A Yap led throughout and made it 12 wins in a row on Sunday when she defeated Sergio who is no stranger to Australian race goers having raced in the SA Coca Cola Derby in October 2009 finishing 5th and more recently won a semi-final of the Golden Easter Egg at Wentworth Park in April finishing 7th in the Group 1 final before heading back to his homeland.

Christchurch will be running their heats today and their fields look outstanding with each heat filled with quality. Each winner will qualify for the final and with the likes of Another Dollar, Sam I Am and Badja Bale in heat 1 and Winsome Opawa (who has won \$164,000 in stakemoney), Fifth Edition and Gripen Bale in heat 2 the New Zealanders will play a strong hand in the Final.

The prizemoney for next week's Final is \$21,600, \$9,000, \$5,000, unplaced \$800 each (\$39,600 NZ in total).

The Troy Murray kennel dominated the heats of the Strathalbyn Cup run on Sunday winning all three heats. Last year Troy had six runners engaged in four heats, winning three of them and qualifying five dogs for the Final. He ended up not only training last year's trifecta in the race with his good race

bitch Aston Rachael winning, he trained the first five past the post. This year Troy will again have a big say in the Final qualifying three greyhounds for the \$6,000 feature to be run on Sunday 25th September.

The first heat on Sunday was taken out in devastating style by Kalden Mayhem winning by over 6 lengths from Dr. Daniel trained by Shaun Laffin confirming his favouritism for the Final. The Troy Murray trained flyer who was recently placed in the National Distance Final at Albion Park showed his true class racing away to victory in track record time over the 536m in a slick 30.88 shaving .06 of the previous track record held by Little Looper set in March of 2008.

The second heat also went the way of Murray with Kalden Kamikaze recording a 4 ³/₄ length victory over the Ken Gill trained Uno Blackjack in a solid 31.25.

The final heat was taken out buy Aston Elite who defeated the Leanne Fagan trained Crafty Lucy by 3 lengths in handy 31.43.



The \$6,000 Strathalbyn Cup Final will be run on Sunday the 25th September which also includes a Consolation and other feature races on the program. The winner of the Cup will also gain automatic preference into the Triple M 40th Adelaide Cup heats run on Thursday 6th October.

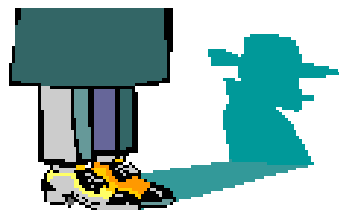

What a huge night of racing this is. This is the build-up before the Adelaide Cup and with many interstate trainers and their young charges here for the final of the Coffex Coffee Oaks, and the 7 heats of the Coca Cola Derby, it will be an exciting night here at headquarters.



Let's try and pick a couple of winners for the night. We will start off in race 1 with the Rob Harnas kennel. Rob looks to have a strangle hold in the opening event with Random Test and Point Two Over. The box draw has favoured Random Test from the red and on last week's win in 29.94 he should prove the goods. Aleta Allen for the Bate kennel should prove too strong in race 11. This dog has been in handy form and ran an eye catching 3.50L 3rd in the Oaks heats last week. He looks well placed to score in the final event.

COCA COLA DERBY HEATS

The best of the 7 heats are the first couple. Have a dollar or two on the well performed Stand At Ease in race 2. With a couple of quick wins up his sleeve at Sandown earlier in the month he should prove the goods. Weekend Rush looks to be the main danger. Mepunga Geordie for the Jeff Britton kennel could start off a big night for the Anakie based kennel, with a win from box two in race 3. He is another who is in terrific form and will be one of the hardest to beat. The same kennel can win heat 3 with Aragorn from box 6. With 5 wins and 8 placings from just 16 starts he should be

too strong. The main dangers are Dyna Fig and Bullicourt Dylan.
